#### 2021-2022 CURRENT DISTRICT GRANTS

- All Grantees must notify the district on the intentions to use remaining grant funds by April 15, 2021
- Project Final Reports are due by June 15, 2021
- Considerations for extension and material modifications to grant awards will be on a case-by-case basis.

## THE ROTARY FOUNDATION (TRF) GRANTS

Clubs are able to apply for two types of grants:

- District Grants
- Global Grants



#### DISTRICT GRANTS

- A single block grant awarded annually for club and district projects (50% of DDF)
- Local decision making with broader guidelines
- Small-scale projects, short-term
- Local or international activities
- Aligned with the Foundation's mission
- Eligible D-7680 clubs may receive a guaranteed 25% of their AF SHARE from 3-years ago

#### DISTRICT GRANTS

- Clubs have access to DDF allocation
- Districts have flexibility for project funding
- District grant funds can go to local and international projects
- Clubs and team with other clubs for larger projects
- Districts have quick access to fund, with easy application and reporting stages

#### CLUB QUALIFICATION FOR DISTRICT GRANTS

- Send at least one club member to grant management seminar sponsored by the district
- Attain \$100 AF per capita giving in current year
- Agree to & Submit the Signed Club Memorandum of Understanding with an Application through DACDB
- Be current in reporting on all existing Grants

#### ROTARACT AND INTERACT CLUBS

- Rotaract Clubs are eligible to apply for district grants pending availability of funds
- Rotaract Clubs are strongly encouraged to partner with other Rotary Clubs to increase the impact of the project.
- All Clubs are encouraged to partner with Rotaract and Interact Clubs in submitting a district grant.





#### **GRANT GUIDELINES**

#### ALL GRANT ACTIVITIES NEED TO:

- Related to the Foundation's mission, but not necessary to align with areas of focus
- Include active participation from Rotarians
- Exclude the Foundation or RI from liability
- Comply with local, state, and federal laws
- Reviewed and approved by Foundation
- Demonstrate sensitivity to traditions and culture

#### ADDITIONAL GUIDELINES

- Comply with Conflict of Interest Policy for Programs
  - A conflict of Interest occurs when someone is in a position to make or influence a decision about a grant or award that could benefit them, an immediate family member, or a business partner that has a significant financial interest or in which any of them is a trustee, director, or officer. If you are not sure about a conflict of interest, please disclose.
- Comply with RI policies regarding the use of the name "Rotary" and logos
- Include signs on or near projects that identify the role of grants sponsors and the Rotary Foundation
- Follow Rotary's Privacy Statement for Personal Data

#### **TELL YOUR ROTARY STORY**

- Ensure your project is following Rotary Brand Guidelines (Logos, etc.)



When a Rotary club has a positive public image, brand, or reputation, current members are motivated to participate in service above self, prospective members are eager to join and sponsors are willing to support service. Often too little is known about Rotary in our communities and opportunities are missed. Telling the story of Rotary is a great way to engage new Rotarians and build more connections with community partners. However, sometimes it seems like an insurmountable task. This site acts as a resource for club leaders, offering support with effective communication strategies, developing a strong brand in accordance with RI guidelines, and creating a public image that engages club members and community organizations.


#### THOU SHALT NOT...

  - Fundraising activities
  - Operating, administrative, or indirect program expenses of another organization
  - Unrestricted cash to a beneficiary or cooperating organization



- Be succinct
- Project Goals should be time based and quantifiable (Think: SMART Goals)
  - Use this: The Rotary Club of Gastonia will provide books for approximately 350 5<sup>th</sup> grade students at JFK Elementary School.
  - Not this: We will support our local school with books and whatever.
- Be creative with active Rotarian involvement.
- Have a publicity plan.

## Partner Organizations

- In some cases, a club may cooperate with another reputable organization to accomplish their project goals.
- All funding provided to cooperating organizations must be used for specific project expenses. The club is required to submit an itemized report of District Grant expenses.
- Funds may not be used for unrestricted or administrative cost







- Have a minimum budget of \$30,000
- Address an important need identified by the community
- Strengthen the community's capacity to address its own needs
- By April 1st, 2023 Identify the project and get it approved by District team
- By May 1st, 2023 Write the grant and submit to Rotary Foundation GG Coordinator
