Although conditions on the ground in NC are slowly improving, there are still many people in need in the western portions of the state (primarily District 7670). Hundreds of roads remain closed and hundreds of thousands of people remain without power.

DANGEROUS CONDITIONS IN WESTERN NORTH CAROLINA

There are shortages of water, food, gas, power, and communications in western NC. Access is limited to local and hurricane response traffic.

You cannot get from North Carolina to TN via I-40 or I-26.

There may be closed roads not listed on <u>DriveNC.gov</u> as many areas are not able to report at this time.

People evacuating the Asheville area can use I-40 east or I-26 east.

We continue to receive helpful information from Rotarians and friends about drop-off locations. Here are three additional locations in different parts of our District:

The focus for this delivery will be to reach more remote locations where it has been challenging to get supplies to. The trailer will actually be parked in front of Jay's home at 2229 E 5th Avenue in Charlotte. Jay asked me to add that his children will be selling lemonade and bracelets on the corner of E 5th St. and Laurel Avenue, with all proceeds going toward filling the trailer with needed supplies.

3. From Rotarian Zachary Parker, Boiling Springs/Shelby NC:



In addition, I participated in a Zoom meeting tonight with clubs from Florida, and DG Connie Molland from District 7670 was on the call. It was the first time I had actually seen Connie since this situation began and she was visibly moved by what has happened there. Let's please continue to keep the good people of District 7670 in our hearts as they grapple with this major incident.
